in Microsoft WORD (or WordPerfect) format. The text should be formatted as follows: Times New Roman 11 point, single line spacing. Plans and line drawings should be sent preferably as an image file (e.g. TIFF/Bitmap). **For sizes of the plans and drawings and of photographs see below.**

Stylesheet for publication of the proceedings of the conference:

***Please no special formatting, no headers, no footers,
no page numbers and so on ...***

Paper-format: DIN A 4 = 29,7 x 21 cm.

Notes and bibliography

Notes

Should appear as footnotes (on every page) and not as endnotes (at the end of the article). Bibliography references only as: “Hodge 1992, 45.” (author, year, page)

Bibliography

At the end of the article in alphabetic order, in the following form:

Books

Author surname (bold), comma, First name (abbreviated with period), Year of publication, comma, Title (in italics), comma, Where published, period.

Examples:

Hodge, A. T. 1992, *Roman Aqueducts & Water Supply*, London.

Koch, H. 1951, *Vom Nachleben des Vitruv*, Baden-Baden.

Landels, J. 1983, *Die Technik der antiken Welt*³, München. [... Welt³ = 3. edition]

Journals and Periodicals

Author surname (bold), comma, First name (abbreviated with period), Year of publication, comma, Title, (regular print) comma, Name of publication (in italics) comma, Pages from - to, period.

Names of publications can be abbreviated if they appear in the enclosed list - e.g. AJA - American Journal of Archaeology.

Examples:

Eschbach, H. 1979, Die Gebrauchswasserversorgung des antiken Pompeji, in: *Antike Welt* 10, 2, 3-24.

Hodge, A. T. 1996, "In Vitruvium Pompeianum": Urban Water Distribution Reappraised, in: *AJA* 100, 261-276.

Edited books/Collection of articles

Author surname(**bold**), comma, First name (abbreviated with period), Year of publication, comma, Title (in italics), comma, in:, Publisher, Year of publication, comma, Pages from - to, period.

Example:

Jansen, G. 2000, Urban Water Transport and Distribution, in: *Wikander 2000*, 103-125.

The details of the edited book itself must also be given separately:

Example:

Wikander, Ö. (ed.) 2000, *Handbook of Ancient Water Technology*, vol. 2, Leiden.

Where there are **several publications by the same author in the same year, the following format should be used:**

Müller 1998a, Müller 1998b, Müller 1998c

Illustrations

Figures & diagrams: a clean original or a good copy on white paper is sufficient. This is preferred to Dia copies. Within reasonable limits, some digital manipulation of the diagrams can be done.

Photographs : a negative or dia version is preferred to prints because in general, they produce better reproductions.

As shown in the following diagram, the printed page size of the book will be about 23 x 15,5 cm with 2 text-columns of about 7,25 cm.

Therefore (normally) only three sizes for figures are preferred:

A – a whole page = 23 x 15,5 cm

B – half page height, whole page width = 15,5 cm

C – width of a column = about 8 cm

Therefore we need for each figure a file in one of the above-mentioned sizes (A/B/C) [of course, if available: the bigger the files are – the better its is] with **300 dpi, preferred as tif-file** or jpg-file.

It is very important that these files are not embedded into the text, but are sent as separate files.
